



Motion Concerning a Cooperation Policy on Lectures

Background

UF has an interest in cooperating with external parties to extend our outreach with the lectures. A cooperation can take many shapes; it can both be a full-scale collaboration on a big lecture which requires calculated economic risk distribution among the cooperating parties, as well as a plea to other organizations to share our lecture event in their channels in exchange for some benefit for their members. Previously, an informal rule was that when a cooperation, the lecture was free for all. Until now, there has however been no clear instructions or rules how to conduct a cooperation, which earlier has severely decimated member base. The UF also risk coming off as unprofessional and arbitrary in relationships with other parties. We wish to clarify once and for all what concerns should be taken into account when planning a cooperation.
